



RUN WITH IT

Habakkuk 2:2

Key Scripture

"Then the Lord answered me and said: 'Write the vision and make it plain on tablets, that he may run who reads it.'"

— Habakkuk 2:2

Introduction

God never gives vision merely to be admired. He gives vision to be acted upon. Habakkuk teaches us that vision is written so that someone can run with it. The church needs more than spectators—it needs runners.

A vision without runners is just potential.

Point 1: Vision Requires Revelation

Key Thought:

Before we can run with the vision, God must reveal the vision.

Habakkuk did not create the vision. God revealed it.

Discussion Questions

1. What is the difference between a good idea and a God-given vision?
2. How does God reveal His vision to His people today?
3. Why is it important to seek God's direction before taking action?

Supporting Thoughts

- Understanding must come before execution.
- Running must follow receiving.
- You cannot run toward what you have not seen.
- The clearer the revelation, the stronger the motivation.

Application

Ask God to reveal His purpose for your life, family, ministry, and church. Commit to seeking God's direction before making major decisions.

Point 2: Vision Requires Responsibility

Key Thought:

Receiving a vision creates a responsibility to act.

God said, "Write the vision." Habakkuk had an assignment.

Discussion Questions

1. What responsibilities come with receiving God's vision?
2. How can we help others understand the vision?
3. What happens when people receive vision but refuse responsibility?

Supporting Thoughts

- Vision requires stewardship.
- Vision must be communicated clearly.
- Vision without runners is just potential.
- God gives revelation, but people must respond.

Application

Identify one responsibility God has placed in your hands. Determine what practical steps you need to take this week.

Point 3: Vision Requires Resolve

Key Thought:

The vision is alive, but it requires people who refuse to quit.

Running requires determination, endurance, and commitment.

Discussion Questions

1. What obstacles often prevent people from running with God's vision?
2. How does faith help us remain committed during difficult seasons?
3. Why is perseverance essential to fulfilling God's purpose?

Supporting Thoughts

- The vision is alive.
- Runners are not spectators.
- Willingness to run determines whether the vision advances.
- Resolve keeps us moving when results are not immediate.
- Every God-given vision will face resistance.

Application

Identify one challenge that has slowed your spiritual progress. Pray for renewed strength and commitment to keep running.

Key Sermon Truths

- ✓ Runners, not spectators, fulfill vision.
